

**JUDGE PAUL R. WALLACE ASSIGNED TO
SUPERIOR COURT'S COMPLEX COMMERCIAL LITIGATION DIVISION**

Wilmington, Delaware – Effective November 30, 2015, Judge Paul R. Wallace is assigned to the Complex Commercial Litigation Division Panel (“CCLD”) succeeding President Judge Jan R. Jurden. Due to Judge Fred S. Silverman’s retirement, Complex Commercial Litigation cases previously assigned to him are re-assigned to Judge Wallace. Any filings or correspondence on those matters on or after November 30, 2015 should be directed to Judge Wallace as provided for in his judicial preferences and the CCLD Standing Orders. The President Judge is confident that Judge Wallace will enhance the excellence of the Complex Commercial Litigation Division through his proven adept ability to handle complex matters of significant public concern in a thoughtful and efficient manner.

In response to the news that Judge Wallace was to be assigned to Superior Court’s Complex Commercial Litigation Division Panel, Fred Cottrell, Esquire, a partner at Richards, Layton & Finger, stated that “members of the Bar handling CCLD cases in the Delaware Superior Court welcome the addition of Judge Wallace to the CCLD Panel. His experience and reasoning will allow the CCLD to continue to be a desired forum for parties to adjudicate complex commercial and business disputes in Delaware.” The Superior Court agrees that Judge Wallace will skillfully manage the current re-assigned CCLD caseload and newly assigned CCLD cases which must include a claim with an amount in controversy of \$1 million or more, or involve an exclusive choice of law agreement.
