**Delaware Judiciary expresses condolences on passing
of recently retired employee Vivian M. Anderson**

The Delaware Judiciary is saddened to report the passing of Vivian M. Anderson, who recently retired as a Judicial Case Processor II for the Arms of the Supreme Court, and offers their condolences to her family and friends and many co-workers in the Judiciary.

Vivian, 69, started work for the Judiciary in 2007 and retired on April 29th, though she still had been reporting to the office on a temporary basis to help train her replacement. The Court was informed of her passing on May 12.

“Vivian was one of those quiet, competent people that make our Judiciary look good to the people we are charged with serving. She was a caring and kind individual who served the Arms of the Court well in representing the Branch to the public as the first person to greet them when they arrived at the office, as well as in all her other duties. Her sudden passing has left us all in mourning,” said Delaware Supreme Court Chief Justice Leo E. Strine, Jr.

Vivian joined the Delaware Courts in May 2007 as a casual/seasonal employee with the Judicial Information Center as a trainer for the COTS system. She then became a full-time employee in 2008, with the title of Judicial Case Processor I for the Arms of the Court and was promoted to Judicial Case Processor II in 2015. Vivian worked at the Arms of the Court offices in the Carvel State Office building and then followed the Arms when the offices moved to the Renaissance Centre last year.

Vivian provided support for many of the Arms of the Court including the Board of Bar Examiners, the Commission on Continuing Legal Education, the Lawyers Fund for Client Protection and the Office of Disciplinary Counsel.

Before joining the Delaware Courts, Vivian had worked as a Paraprofessional School Aide for the Brandywine School District. She also worked for Mars, Inc. as a support analyst and Keane Inc. as a Programmer/Analyst consultant.

The viewing and service will be held at New Community Church, 116 West 41st Street in Wilmington on Tuesday, May 24, 2016. The public viewing will be from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. followed by the service at 11 a.m. Interment will be held immediately following the service at Gracelawn Memorial Park, 2220 N. Dupont Highway in New Castle.
