Victims' Voices Heard (A Center for Community Justice Program) is a statewide program which provides victims and survivors of violent offenses the opportunity to speak directly to the person who caused them harm. The dialogue process can only be initiated at the request of the victim. Offenders participate in the program only because they want to do something to help the victim reclaim their life. They receive no sentence reduction and it cannot be used as part of their parole or pardon package. Victims and Offenders work with a

facilitator on a preparation process that will take approximately (6) months to complete. Once the preparation process package is complete a determination will be made as to whether or not dialogue is safe for both parties.

Dialogue gives the victim the opportunity:

- Express anger and pain directly to the person responsible
- Ask questions and receive answers
- Hear responsibility and remorse expressed
- Feel empowered

If a victim/survivor wants to access this information they may contact V V H to see if a letter of apology has been written.
