**AMENDED ADMINISTRATIVE DIRECTIVE NO. 155** 

This 25<sup>th</sup> day of October 2004

**IT APPEARS THAT:** 

(1) On April 5, 2004, Administrative Directive No. 155 was issued relating to expanded

electronic media coverage of judicial proceedings in the trial courts.

(2) In that Directive, it was stated that the expanded coverage was "effective April 15, 2004

... during an experimental period ending on October 15, 2004, unless extended by a further

Administrative Directive or Supreme Court Rule. . . . "

(3) The Bar Bench Media Conference has requested that the Supreme Court extend the

experimental period to permit the electronic news media to cover cases that might arise in an

extended experimental period.

(4) The Court has evaluated the Conference's proposal, and agrees that it is desirable to

extend the experimental period.

**NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS DIRECTED**, with the approval of a majority of the members

of the Supreme Court, pursuant to Delaware Constitution, art. IV, § 13(1), that Administrative

Directive No. 155 is hereby amended by extending the experimental period from October 15, 2004

to May 16, 2005.
