Mission: To improve the multidisciplinary response to child sexual abuse cases in accordance with the Memorandum of Understanding for the Multidisciplinary Response to Child Abuse and Neglect ("MOU") by addressing the following:

- 1. Identify system weaknesses and strengths in the investigation, prosecution and treatment of child sexual abuse cases and create an Action Plan of priorities;
