JUSTICE RANDY J. HOLLAND RECEIVES LEGISLATIVE TRIBUTES

The Honorable Randy J. Holland of the Delaware Supreme Court received tributes both from the Delaware State Senate and the Delaware House of Representatives on June 16, 2009 for his tenure on the Delaware Supreme Court. Speaker of the House Robert F. Gilligan and Representative V. George Carey presented the House Tribute and the Senate Tribute was presented by Senate Majority Leader Anthony J. De Luca. Justice Holland was appointed to the Supreme Court on December 12, 1988, thus making him the longest serving Justice of the Court. At the time of his initial appointment, Justice Holland was the youngest member to serve on the Supreme Court.

In addition to the tributes from the legislature, Justice Holland was presented with a tribute from Delaware Governor Jack Markell in a ceremony in the Governor's office in Dover. Justice Holland is a graduate of Swarthmore College and the University of Pennsylvania School of Law. He received his Masters of Law from the University of Virginia School of Law in 1998 and an Honorary Doctorate from Widener University School of Law. Justice Holland serves on the United States Judicial Conference Advisory Committee on Appellate Rules; the Widener Law School Board of Overseers; and the University of Pennsylvania Law Alumni Society Board of Managers. Justice Holland is a past national President of the American Inns of Court Foundation and a member of the American Law Institute. He is the first honorary member of the American Inn of Court, London and was named an Honorary Master of Bench, Lincoln's Inn in London. In 2007, Justice Holland received the American Inns of Court's A. Sherman Christensen Award.

Justice Holland resides in Milford with his wife, Dr. Ilona Holland.
