At the Administrative Office of the Courts, Kevin joins the leadership team under State Court Administrator Amy Quinlan and will be in charge of overseeing legal matters along with other administrative and supervisory duties.

Kevin is married with two children and is an avid, if not very successful, golfer. He identifies New Hampshire as his "happy place" and, as the father of two children, he said he dearly misses his days as a prosecutor when he used to be able to get a word in edgewise.
