PAYMENT OF SECURED CASH BAIL OR OF FINES, COSTS, VICTIM'S

COMPENSATION FUND ASSESSMENTS OR RESTITUTION BY VISA OR

MASTERCARD

Recently I met with Herb Barrett, Special Markets Executive of Comdata Network, Inc., ¹ a Tennessee corporation licensed to do business in the State of Delaware. He informed me of a service they undertake to all VISA or Mastercard holders who are arrested on traffic or criminal charges. For a fee, Comdata will pay by check² a defendant's cash bail or a defendant's fines, costs, VCF or restitution charging the amount thereof against the VISA or Mastercard account of the defendant or of the cardholder if the cardholder is other than the defendant. In that this procedure will likely increase the amount of money collected by the Courts for bail or for fines, costs, VCF or restitution, I have agreed to permit the Justice of the Peace Court system to utilize this collection method.

Hereinafter referred to as Comdata.

Therefore, the following procedures will be utilized whenever a defendant wishes to transfer money from his VISA or Mastercard or, with the consent of a third party, from a third party's VISA or Mastercard:

After learning of a defendant's wish to transfer money to the Court from his VISA or Mastercard or from a third party's VISA or Mastercard, the clerk should:

- 1. Inform the cardowner of the Comdata service charge and obtain his/her verbal agreement to have money wired.
 - 2. Call Comdata toll-free: 1-800-225-4455.
- 3. Tell the Comdata representative that "This is an FB \$4> order. My service center code is FB $___$."
 - 4. Give the Comdata representative:
- A. Defendant's name and cardowner's name (if different from defendant);
 - B. Mastercard or VISA number;

- C. Expiration date of card;
- D. ICA number (Mastercard only);
- E. <u>Cardowner's</u> home address (street number, city, state and zip code) and home phone number; and
 - F. Amount to be wired.
- 5. Within minutes, the Comdata representative will verify the transaction and call you back.
- 6. The Comchek representative will request that you fill out a Comchek:⁵
- A. Give the representative the check number (upper right hand corner).
 - B. Fill in date, Payee (the defendant) and amount.
- C. Fill in the authorization number (middle left portion) that the Comdata representative gives you.
- 7. Have the defendant endorse the check to your particular Justice of the Peace Court.
 - 8. The guaranteed check may then be deposited.

Mr. Barrett has produced 8" x 10" posters for each of the 14 traffic/criminal Justice of the Peace Courts which, when received, should be displayed in the reception area. These posters will inform all defendants of the possibility of paying Court financial obligations by VISA or Mastercard.

The 14 traffic/criminal Justice of the Peace Courts are assigned the following service center FB code numbers:

DA copy of a Comchek (front and reverse sides) is attached hereto as Appendix A. Examples which explain the above procedures are shown at Appendix B.

Each Chief Clerk of the above-referenced Justice of the Peace Courts will receive along with this Policy Directive a package containing a procedural check-list prepared by Comdata, a service charge schedule and a book of Comcheks for use by that particular Court.

Once an authorization has been given by Comdata, the check, endorsed by the defendant, should be deposited in the Court's account. The payment thereof is guaranteed by Comdata.

I believe that this procedure, whereby Comdata transfers emergency cash to VISA and Mastercard cardholders, charging the transfer to their VISA or Mastercard account, will decrease the instances where a defendant is unable to post bail or to pay for fines, costs, VCF assessments or restitution at the time of sentencing. 8 This procedure is particularly appropriate with regard to out-of-state defendants who are outside of their banking areas. Therefore, it is worthy of our support and participation.

⁶Mr. Barrett will contact each Chief Clerk periodically with regard to the issuance of additional checkbooks.

⁷If the check covers the amount of bail and the defendant appears for trial and is convicted, the amount of any fines, costs and VCF may be credited against the amount of bail collected. If there is money due to the defendant, the Court should issue to the defendant a Court check covering the difference.

With regard to bail, if the case is to be transferred to another Court, the clerk should simply give the completed paperwork to Chief Clerk, after giving the defendant a receipt, and, thereafter, the Chief Clerk will forward a check drawn from the particular Justice of the Peace Court's account made out to the Court to which the case is being transferred in the amount of the bail set, along with the normal paperwork.

The procedures contained in this Policy Directive shall be effective commencing Thursday, January 1, 1984.





GREENBACKS

Policy Directive 83-082, dated December 27, 1983, dealt with Comcheks. Here, we deal with the NTS GreenBack Money Transfer System used by NTS trucking company clients. This system is described by Bernadette J. Pian, Product Manager for NTS, Inc., in her letter to me dated December 10, 1987:

"NTS, Inc. has provided fuel management and financial services to the trucking industry for 25 years. Our GreenBack Money Transfer System is accepted at truck stops, banks, convenience stores and point-of-entry/weigh stations from coast to coast. We would like to provide this service to our clients through the courts of Delaware.

NTS, Inc. is owned by PHH Group, a New York Stock Exchange company headquartered in Baltimore, Maryland. PHH has a 5Al Dun and Bradstreet Rating, over 3.5 billion dollars in assets, and a billion dollar revolving credit line with major banks. The financial backing of NTS/PHH Group guarantees payment on any GreenBack draft, once authorized by NTS with a simple authorization number.

GreenBack is a safe and convenient way to accept payment for overweight loads, permits and

No special telehpone lines, wiring or machines are needed for GreenBack, and no fees are charged to you. Your clerks need only to follow instructions that are printed on the draft. Our Service Center operates 24 hours a day, 365 days a year; authorization codes for GreenBack drafts are toll-free call just away. GreenBack's authorization system has the fastest turnaround time in the industry - we average thirty-five seconds. Once authorized, you will then process GreenBack drafts just as you would a Western Union check or a Comchek."

It is the request of NTS, Inc., that the Courts of the Justices of the Peace for the State of Delaware accept NTS GreenBacks for the payment of Motor Vehicle Code and Motor Fuel Tax violations committed by truckers authorized to use the NTS GreenBack Money Transfer System. As with Comcheks, I see no reason why our courts should not accept GreenBacks, so long as proper procedures are followed. These procedures are extremely simple as may be seen from reviewing the attached Instructional Sheet.

In light of the above, effective immediately, Magistrate Court clerical personnel are authorized to accept NTS GreenBacks from NTS GreenBack Money Transfer System users in payment of fines and other court costs and fees so long as the procedures as set forth on the accompanying Instructional Sheet are scrupulously observed.

Several blank "GreenBacks" are being forwarded to each traffic/criminal court under separate cover. In the normal case, I believe that the user will produce a blank NTS GreenBack within his own possession, so the forwarded blank NTS GreenBacks should last a while. In either case, it is most important that the user

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fill in the money transfer code box with the other information required and that the clerk obtains a 4 digit authorization number from the 24 hour NTS service center by telephoning the applicable 1-800 number.

GREENBACK INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE U.S. COURT SYSTEM

- 1. Tell the driver the exact name to arrange for on the "Pay to the Order" of line. For example, the check may be made payable to "The State of Nevada", the" District Court of Michigan", "The Circuit Court of Illinois" or the "City of Odessa, Municipal Court" He will also need the exact dollar amount.
- 2. The driver will fill in the "Money Transfer Code" box, the Date, and the Amount. He enters his drivers license number on the back of the draft.
- 3. The Court System Offical calls the NTS 24 hour service center at 1-800-433-2165. The operator will ask for his telephone number, the transaction code, the draft number (on the upper right hand side of the draft), the payee name, and the dollar amount.
- 4. NTS verifies the transaction and responds with a 4 digit authorization number.
- 5. The Court System Offical writes the authorization number on the draft in the lower left hand box and deposits the check just as he would a Western Union check or Comchek.

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
