She is a member of the Delaware State Bar Association and previously served as Vice President for the Solo & Small Firms Section in Kent County. She also serves on the Commission on Continuing Legal Education and is a member of the Kent County and Sussex County Bar Associations, the Woman and the Law Section, and the Family Law Section.
