ORDER

After consideration of the notice to show cause and the response, it appears to the Court that:

- (1) On June 19, 2019, the petitioner, Anthony Rhea, filed a petition for a writ of mandamus directing the Superior Court to remove the six-month probationary portion of his sentence. At that time, Rhea's motion for sentence correction that also sought removal of the six-month probationary portion of his sentence was pending in the Superior Court. The Superior Court granted Rhea's motion on August 2, 2019.
- (2) On August 8, 2019, the Senior Court Clerk issued a notice directing Rhea to show cause why this appeal should not be dismissed for his failure to pay the filing fee or to file a motion to proceed *in forma pauperis* and for mootness in light of the Superior Court's decision. In his response to the notice to show cause, Rhea states that he no longer seeks a writ of mandamus. Rhea does not dispute that his writ of petition for a writ of mandamus is moot. He also has failed to pay the fee or a motion to proceed *in forma pauperis*. Rhea's petition must be dismissed.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the petition for the issuance of a writ of mandamus is DISMISSED.
