 Protect children



PFA = Victim Safety

Goals:
Protect victims
Provide relief to manage safety
Deter future harm

Priorities:
• Keep defendant away
• Punish violations


Custody = Restructuring Family

Goals:

* Establish parental access

* Allocate parental decision-making

* Foster post-separation stability Priorities: Support parent-child relationships
 Promote best interests of the child

BACK TO OUR HYPOTHETICAL

- Facts:

 *7-year old boy calls 911 his father is beating up his mother

 *911 operator can hear a commotion in the background

 *Mother is yelling for help

 *Son is upset and screaming at his father to stop

- Posture of the Case:
 Father has been arrested and charged with domestic violence
 Child welfare has substantiated abuse
 Whother has filled a petition for a PFA
 Father has filed for divorce

IN SUM...

- Different legal settings have different:

 *Missions and purposes relative to domestic violence

 *Approaches to domestic violence

 *Expectations of people who experience domestic violence

 *Tools and limitations that can impact their response to domestic violence

Different professionals within those legal settings have different:
*Roles and functions relative to domestic violence and the parties
*Approaches, expectations, tools, and limitations regarding domestic
violence

IN SUM...

Professionals tend to operate within one or two legal settings Sometimes, that is due to statutory authority and/or limits Sometimes, it is a matter of resource allocation Sometimes, it is just business as usual

- Forties tend to bounce between and among different legal settings
 Sometimes, they are where they are by virtue of choice
 Sometimes, they are where they are by virtue of choice
 Sometimes, they are where they are due to circumstances beyond their control
 Practitioners should endeavor to:
 Understand the complexity of managing safety across multiple systems
 Recognize and account for the competing demands on parties
 Develop coordinated responses that include PFA and custody interventions
