STEPS TO BECOME AN e-FILER IN JP COURT

Be a Valid Filer Type

 Members of Delaware State Bar can file for any party on the case and must submit all filings electronically

Pro-Se filers represent themselves and must file electronically when they have filed more than ten (10) other civil actions in the Justice of the Peace Court

Form 50 Agents represent a company or organization and must file electronically when they have 5 or more filings

Complete e-Flex Training

- Classroom training has been replaced with on-line training as of January, 2019
- Filers must watch 34 video modules (~90 total minutes)
- Filers must submit a written certification that they completed the training

Request an e-Flex Logon ID

After completing the training filers may request an e-Flex Logon ID. See Module 4 –
Requesting a Logon ID for more details.

Form 50 Agents

- To apply to become a Form 50 Agent, a "Certificate of Representation for an Artificial Entity or Public Body in Civil Cases in the Justice of the Peace Court" must be completed and renewed each calendar year for each company the agent represents.
- Applications approved on or after December 15 are valid for the next calendar year.
- A copy of this form must be submitted with every new filing or when identifying yourself as the contact person for the company. It must also be taken to Court with you whenever you appear as the representative of the company.

- Each person will be assigned their own FA Number (Form 50 number). That number starts with the letters 'FA' followed by the assigned digits. There are no spaces in this number.
