	Social isolation
	Mental health history/issues
	LGBTQ, gender non-conforming, non-binary
	Inability to meet basic needs (esp. if runaway)
	Association with gang members/gang involvement
	Association with those involved in commercial sexual exploitation of children (CSEC)
INDICATORS	
	Appears exhausted and/or malnourished
	Signs of abuse (bruises, cuts, burn marks)—esp. if unexplained
	Changes in physical appearance—new clothing, hair, nails
	Tattoos and/or branding—esp. if hard to explain
	Sudden change of friends
	Changes in behavior/demeanor and/or loss of interest in previous activities
	Poor school attendance and/or truancy
	Older/adult boyfriend or girlfriend—esp. if referred to as "daddy"
	Absence of a cell phone/possession of multiple cell phones or pre-paid phones
	Possession of hotel keys
	Possession of prepaid credit cards or unusual amounts of cash
	Multiple accounts on social media platforms—esp. with sexually explicit profiles
	<ul> <li>Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, Snapchat, Flickr, Meetup, Whatsapp, Omegele,</li> </ul>
	Dubsmash, HouseParty, TikTok
	Frequent travel to other cities, counties or states
	Unexplained pregnancies or multiple terminated pregnancies
	History of multiple STDs/STIs
	Multiple sex partners
	Frequenting an area known for commercial sex
